**THE SAVIOR**

The heavenly messenger told Joseph the precious name by which the Savior would be called. *"Thou shalt call His name Jesus: for He shall save His people from their sins"* (Matthew 1:21). Christ alone is the Savior. *"And we have seen and do testify that the Father sent the Son to be the Saviour of the world"* (1 John 4:14). The Lord Jesus is not an assistant Savior; He didn't do His part in salvation and now the sinner must do his. NO! Christ did not come into this world to help us in saving ourselves. He did not leave the glories of heaven and stoop so low as to die the horrible death of the cross and then share the responsibility and the glory of salvation with sinners. He did not humble Himself and become obedient unto death in order to render everyone savable, nor did He die to make salvation a possibility. *"He shall save His people from their sins."* Well then, here is the question: was He successful in doing what He came to do? The prophet declared, *"He shall not fail nor be discouraged till He have set judgment in the earth: and the isles shall wait for His law"* (Isaiah 42:4). He could not fail for lack of strength or wisdom. He could not be discouraged by all the opposition against Him. His mission was to satisfy the justice of God for the sins of His people by the sacrifice of Himself. He came to establish righteousness for those the Father gave Him.

Christ is not a want-to-be Savior: He is the Savior who saved His people from their sins by His substitutionary sacrifice upon the cross. He is the very Savior we need for He is God and Man in one person. He is God to satisfy and do business with the Father for us, and He is Man to suffer, bleed, die, rise again and someday bring many sons unto glory (Hebrews 2:10). Salvation is of the Lord, from top to bottom. The Lord is Alpha and Omega in the salvation of sinners and He is everything in-between. *"To the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen"* (Jude 1:25).
