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Child of God, when afflictions befall you, you shall see your God near at hand, "a very present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1). "Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for it" (Ephesians 5:25). There is no love to which the love of Christ for His people can be compared. His is a love that exceeds any human love as the ocean is infinitely superior to a cup of water. It is a generally accepted principle that love is known by the sacrifice it will make. Those who love little will sacrifice little; those who love much will sacrifice much. But consider the love of Christ for His church. "Greater love hath no man than this that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13). The greatness of His love for the bride the Father gave Him is to be seen in the greatness of the sacrifice which He gave to save her. "Christ also hath loved us, and <u>hath given Himself for us</u> an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour" (Ephesians 5:2). —Pastor Jim Byrd

THE AWFULNESS OF SIN

Judge the awfulness of sin by the sacrifice required to remove it. We know that a just God would never require an unfair payment for sin. His justice would not demand more, nor settle for less than the price required to remove it. Behold the cross of Calvary. See who is fastened to the cursed tree. It is the Lord's Anointed, the holy, spotless, eternal Son of God, the Man Christ Jesus. Why does He hang there? Why does He suffer so? Why does He cry out, "My God, my God, why hast Thou forsaken me?" Why does He die? It is because He bore the sins of His own people and since a holy God demands satisfaction for crimes against Him, Christ must suffer, bleed and die as the Substitute for sinners. "God spared not His Own Son but delivered Him up for us all" (Romans 8:32). Learn then the awfulness of sin by the payment required to put it away. "Christ died for our sins" (1 Corinthians 15:3). Let me weep over my sin that caused His grief and let me rejoice in Him who bore it for me and whose death removed it from me "as far as the east is from the west" (Psalm 103:12). —Pastor Jim Byrd

THE SOLID GROUND OF DIVINE SOVEREIGNTY

"Lord, who hath believed our report? And to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed" (Isaiah 53:1)? I suppose every preacher of the gospel, and every church, at some point, becomes a little dejected and raises the same sort of questions Isaiah did. Let us at those times remember that the revelation of the gospel to the hearts of sinners is the Lord's work which He will perform according to His eternal purpose. When discouraged, let us retreat to the sovereignty of God to strengthen us under the difficulties and disappointments which accompany the declaration of the gospel. The application of His Word of truth to the hearts of our hearers is His business; He saves whomever He will and He does it whenever He will. It is only when we rest upon the solid ground of divine sovereignty that we will find consolation no matter what happens. Let us continue to be faithful in proclaiming the gospel and leave the revelation of truth to the Lord who alone can make the Word effectual to the hearts of sinners. —Pastor Jim Byrd -0------
