THE ROD OF AARON BLOSSOMED

"For sin shall not have dominion over you; for ye are not under law, but under grace" (Romans 6:14-15). When we are regenerated by the Spirit of the Lord and brought into a living union with the dear Redeemer, we will despise sin and love grace. In the presence of the Lord of glory we will bear fruit for His glory. The power that grace has upon us is like the power of the Holy of Holies upon the rod of Aaron. While the rod of Aaron remained at a distance from the tabernacle, it was just a dried up, barren, fruitless stick. However, when it was placed in the Holy of Holies, when it came into the presence of the Shekinah glory of God, it came to life and became fruitful. *"Behold the rod of Aaron budded and brought forth buds, and bloomed blossoms, and yielded almonds"* (Numbers 17:8). When we are brought to believe Christ, His life-giving power has an irresistible effect upon us. Sin is no longer loved, it is hated; grace is no more despised, it is adored; barrenness is replaced by fruitfulness. Whereas we were the willing servants of sin, by grace we become the willing servants of righteousness.
