UNCHANGING LOVE

It is written of our Savior, "Having loved His own which were in the world, He loved them unto the end" (John 13:1). The Lord's love for His people is like Himself, incapable of change. "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). What a delightful subject to dwell upon! We are the beloved of His heart, the eternal objects of His electing grace. The affection He has for us will never cease nor change. As the Lord said to Jeremiah, so He says to all of His people, "Yea, I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with lovingkindness have I drawn thee" (Jeremiah 31:3).
