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GOOD NEWS

No sermon deserves the name of a gospel message which does not set forth the good news that everything the thrice holy God required for the salvation of His people was fully and finally accomplished by the substitutionary sacrifice of the Lord Jesus Christ. He satisfied the demands of a broken law for His people when for our sins He suffered, bled and died. "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree" (Galatians 3:13). The strokes of divine justice fell upon that blessed One Who died upon the cross in the stead of His people. The salvation of a chosen race was conditioned upon Him being "obedient unto death, even the death of the cross" (Philippians 2:8). God Almighty looked to His Son for complete satisfaction to His every demand and He was not disappointed.

It is not good news to set conditions before a sinner which they must meet before sin can be put away and God can declare them to be righteous. If you lay down certain ceremonies he must observe, spiritual advances he must make, specific duties he must perform or rigid precepts he must obey, you give him no hope at all; in fact, you mock him in his misery. If salvation is dependent upon any contribution on the part of the sinner, he must forevermore be lost; being sinful and alienated from God because of iniquities, there is no possibility of him ever winning Divine favor.

The gospel of the blessed God is good news for helpless sinners because it declares, "the salvation of the righteous is of the LORD" (Psalm 37:39). He appointed a people unto salvation and the Lord Jesus has cancelled the indebtedness of all those chosen ones. By His death He removed their sins and brought in everlasting righteousness. The exalted Sovereign sends to them the Holy Spirit Who grants them spiritual life, repentance and faith. He gives them the blessed assurance that Christ accomplished everything demanded to justify them before God. This is God's salvation that is conditioned upon, not the sinner, but upon the Savior. Here is good news indeed!

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FORGIVENESS

"But there is forgiveness with Thee, that Thou mayest be feared" (Psalm 130:4). What He says concerning some of His works of providence, "Be still, and know that I am God," may be much more said concerning this great effect of His grace; "still your souls and know that He is God." It is, in a word, forgiveness that is with God, and by the exercise whereof He will be known so to be - God Himself doth really separate and distinguish His forgiveness from anything that our thoughts and imaginations can reach unto; and that because it is His, and it is like Himself. Forgiveness is an object for faith alone which can rest in that which it cannot comprehend. Faith is never safer than when it is, as it were, overwhelmed with infiniteness. --John Owen
